FRESH POLIO CASE REPORTED

South India, a hither to Polio free zone has reported its first case in Ananthpur and Kurnool district (Times of India, dated 2.09.03) sending the State Department officials into frenzy. Mop-up Polio Vaccinatlot1 Campaign is scheduled to be conducted in all the surrounding villages from September, 7th, 2003.

POLIO ERADICATION CAMPAIGN

As of 30 June, the polio eradication fundraising campaign (PEFC) has exceeded its goal by more than US\$ 30 million. A total of US \$111, 499,351 in cash, commitments, District Designated Funds, and government matching funds has been raised to help make the world polio free.

Although the campaign has succeeded in surpassing its goal, Rotarians are urged to continue to send in their contributions to fulfill commitments made to the campaign. Contributions will be accepted until 30 June, 2005.

ROTARIAN IS WINNER OF 2003 UN POPULATION AWARD

Werner Fomos of the Rotary Club of Washington, D.C., USA, is the 2003 United Nations Population Award laureate in the, in the individual category.

"No generation owns our planet. But each generation is charged with its stewardship," said Fomos in his acceptance speech at the 18th June award ceremony at UN Headquarters, New York. He remarked that stewardship of the earth involves recognizing our planet's remarkable potential and fragility, slowing-down population growth, and eradicating poverty, as well as socially and economically empowering women to improve family health and welfare. Reducing over-consumption in the developed world should also be considered an essential component of concerted efforts to use our planet's finite resources in more sustainable ways.

CLUBS REMEMBER VICTIMS OF 9/11 WITH MEMORIAL CLOCK

Like many of the communities surrounding New York City, Westchester County located about 30 miles from downtown Manhattan - suffered losses on 11 September, 2001, when two airplanes crashed into the World Trade Center, killing 2,801 people. Hoping to keep alive the memory of the nine members of their community who lost their lives in the attacks, the Rotary Club of Eastchester, New York, USA, is donating a clock for permanent display outside Town Hall.

U.S. Rotarians join effort to reduce infant mortality in Russia. When the economy of a country is in turmoil, problems manifest themselves in a variety of ways - many of them related to health care. In Russia, health officials say a collapsing health care system has created an alarming increase in the rate of infant mortality.

Joining forces with a private initiative called the Future of Russia Foundation (FORF), the Rotary Club of Atlanta, Georgia, U.S.A., has embarked on a comprehensive effort to improve health care for mothers and infants in Russia.

"Today, more than 50 percent of Russian babies are born unhealthy, and infant mortality is unacceptably high," said Rotarian Dr A.W. Brann Jr., an Emory University School of Medicine professor of pediatrics and (FORF), medical director. "The biggest need right now is to help a woman have and carry to term a pregnancy she wants to have".
