10 common tricks used by scamsters

Middle-aged and elderly people are most vulnerable, though even youngsters fall into the traps laid by fraudsters.



TRAI action against phone

You get a call supposedly from the Telecom Regulatory Authority of India (TRAI) saying your mobile number has been used for illegal activities, so phone services will be suspended The call is then forwarded to a fraudster posing as an official of the cybercrime cell of police.

Put under digital arrest

Posing as a police officer, the fraudster accuses the victim or relative of a crime. A fake CBi officer conducts an interrogation via video or audio call and threatens digital arrest

ce have clarified that they do not do digital arrests or online interrogation of the connect call and report number.



Parcel stuck at customs

The victim is told that a parcel containing contraband has been intercepted by the customs department. The average person panics and agrees to pay to hush up the case. The victim could also be asked to send some amount for the release of the shipment.

nect call and report n

Credit card issued in your name

A fake executive calls to say a large transaction was conducted on the victim's credit card and wants to confirm it. The credit card is bogus so the victim's call is forwarded to another fraudster who offers to help. Once they gain trust, they ask for card details, CVV and OTP.

ard issued in your name, you will get SMS out the transaction. Check with your bank.



Family member arrested

Someone posing as a policeman informs the victim that a close relative will be arrested on a serious charge. The victim is told to pay up for the charges to be dropped. Some may even use AI to mimic the family member.

Money transferred by mistake

Victim gets a fake text message that some amount has been credited to his account. Scamster then calls up and says the transaction was done by mistake and wants the victim to return the money. The text message is not from bank and no money was actually transferred.

k your bank account to confirm whether ev has been received before you act.

Get rich by trading stocks

Social media ads promise lucrative 30-40% returns from stocks. Victims are directed to a fake website that grants them access to a bogus portfolio. Scammers initially give very high returns on a small sum of money encouraging victim to invest more. When he tries to withdraw, scamsters vanish.

Victim receives an SMS, call, or e-mail asking to update his KYC details by clicking on a link. The link takes him to a website that gets access to his device and steals personal information.

Banks never send links for online updation of KYC. They always insist on a branch visit or an in-person interaction.



Earn big from easy tasks

Scammers offer high sums for simple tasks such as liking YouTube videos or social media posts. The victim is then asked to invest in cryptos and other assets for high returns. A small sum is credited to victim's account to appear legitimate. When victim puts in a large sum, scamsters vanish.

Generous tax refund

KYC has expired

Taxpayers who have filed their tax return or are expecting a tax refund get a phone call from fraudsters posing as tax officials. They ask the taxpayer to furnish bank details so that the refund can be expedited. Once they get the details, they clean the bank account.

The tax department sends SMS and mail directly to the taxpayer. It already has the taxpayer's bank details.



'Forever chemicals' have made our body their homes

Chemicals from food packaging can cause carcinogenicity, reproductive toxicity, and endocrine disruption

- Bisphenol A (BPA): Often used in plastics and resins, BPA can disrupt hormones and has been linked to various health issues
- Phthalates: These are used to make plastics more flexible. Some phthalates are known to be toxic to reproduction and can disrupt endocrine functions
- Per-and Polyfluoroalkyl Substances (PFAS): These chemicals are used in non-stick cookware, waterrepellent clothing, and food packaging. They are persistent in the environment and human body and can lead to adverse health effects
- Styrene: Found in polystyrene plastics and resins, styrene is a possible human carcinogen
- Lead and cadmium: These metals can be found in some food contact materials and are known to be toxic, affecting multiple organs and systems in the body
- Benzophenone: Used in coatings and inks, benzophenone is a suspected carcinogen and endocrine disruptor
- BADGE (Bisphenol A diglycidyl ether) and its derivatives: These are used in epoxy resins and can cause endocrine disruption and other toxic effects







Beware of BPA

- Bisphenol A is an industrial chemical used mainly in the production of epoxy resins, which are ingredients in various consumer products.
- It is often used to make water bottles, baby bottles, food storage containers and the linings of metalbased food cans, and is notorious for its tendency to get into food and drink.
- BPA can act on the body as an oestrogen mimic and, thus, disrupt the hormonal equilibrium.
- It adversely targets the growth and health of the reproductive system, especially in foetuses and young children.
- BPA exposure during critical developmental periods can affect brain development, potentially leading to behavioural issues such as anxiety and attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD) in children.





Adverse health effects of phthalates

- Reduced growth rate
- Hepatic (liver) and renal (kidney) effects



Developmental and reproductive effects



- Reduced foetal weight
- Cryptorchidism, a condition when testes fail to descend from the abdomen into the scrotum
- Hypospadias, a birth defect affecting the urethral opening in men
- Reduced anogenital distance in males
- Testicular toxicity
- Hepatocellular carcinoma
- Effects on foetal growth

How to avoid consuming packaging chemicals

- Minimise the time food spends in contact with packaging.
- Do not reheat food in its original packaging.
- Opt for unwrapped fresh produce from local farmers markets.
- Store food in glass, stainless steel, or ceramic containers.
- Policymakers should regulate and restrict hazardous food contact chemicals (FCCs).
- Conduct thorough safety assessments of all FCCs.

- The food industry should use materials that do not leach harmful chemicals.
- Choose BPA-free, phthalate-free, and PFAS-free products.
- Avoid plastics with recycling codes 3 (PVC), 6 (PS), and 7 (other).
- Avoid canned goods, which may have BPA linings.
- Oily or fatty foods wrapped in printed paper or plastic may absorb unhealthy chemicals.





Meningitis, a global public health challenge, Marburg outbreak, WHO response in Lebanon



While meningitis affects all ages, young children are most at risk.

Meningitis is the inflammation of the tissues surrounding the brain and spinal cord. It is usually caused by infection, and can be fatal hence requires immediate medical care. Bacterial meningitis is the most common dangerous type of meningitis and can be fatal within 24 hours. Vaccines offer the best protection against common types of bacterial meningitis.







The Rwanda Ministry of Health announced an outbreak of Marburg virus disease.

So far, 36 cases have been confirmed, including 11 deaths, from seven of the country's 30 districts. 25 patients are isolated and receiving care. More than 70% of the confirmed cases are health workers from two health facilities in the capital, Kigali.







Lebanon's health workers speak about professional struggles amid increasing conflict



Health workers in Lebanon are facing challenging circumstances as they confront death and destruction on a personal and professional level. Lebanon's health system has been thrust into crisis following the explosion of message-receiving devices on 17 and 18 September, and the events that followed.





WHO launched the Global Strategic Preparedness, Readiness and Response Plan to tackle dengue and other Aedes mosquito-borne arboviruses.

Dengue cases have surged across all six WHO regions, with an estimated 4 billion people at risk of globally. The number of cases has approximately doubled each year since 2021.

As the violence intensifies, WHO, in coordination with the Ministry of Public Health and other partners, remains committed to addressing the critical needs of Lebanon's health sector and ensuring health workers have the support they need to continue saving lives.
